US Small Business Administration

- The Presidential disaster declaration covers the counties of Hawai'i, Maui, and the City and County of Honolulu, which are eligible for both Physical damage loans and Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) from the SBA. Small businesses and most private, non-profit organizations in the Kalawao and Kaua'i counties are eligible to apply only for SBA EIDLs.

County Real Property Assessment Division

Application for Disaster Remission of Taxes

- This application is only for real property taxes paid, or due. In all cases, the amount of remission will not reduce the total annual taxes to less than the minimum tax for the parcel.
- If you are currently paying the minimum tax, do not complete this form, as no remission will be calculated. The remission calculation will be based on the balance of the tax year from the date of occurrence.
- Also, this is a remission on real property taxes and applies to land and structures, and does not include personal property (furniture, vehicles, equipment, etc.). The Real Property Tax Office does not assess, or tax, improvements to your property such as retaining walls, fences, landscaping, and driveways. Damage of this type would not result in any remission of taxes.
- File on or before June 30, 2026.

UH-CTAHR's Agriculture Diagnostic Service Center (ADSC)

- If your farm was impacted by the March and April 2026 flooding; you can submit UP TO THREE free samples for each of these testing services through July 21, 2026:
 - Soil nutrient
 - Plant tissue nutrient
 - Plant disease
 - Insect identification
- Farmers simply need to confirm that their operations were affected by the recent floods when ordering services.

Agricultural Flood Loss Assessment Tool

Use this tool to estimate flood-related crop and farm losses for insurance, disaster assistance, grant documentation, or your own records. After submission, you will receive a PDF summary by email.

Before You Begin

Enter one crop or production unit at a time. After each crop entry, you will be asked whether you want to add another crop before submitting the form.

Please use your best estimate for sale price, replanting costs, cleanup costs, damaged materials, infrastructure damage, and any other reported losses.

What the Tool Calculates

1. Crop loss value using expected yield, actual yield, and sale price
2. Additional reported costs such as replanting, cleanup, and infrastructure damage
3. A total estimated farm loss summary sent to you as a PDF by email

Flooding and Farm Food Safety in Hawaii Flooding is the overflowing of a field with water outside of the grower's control, and it creates food safety risks due to pathogens, sewage, chemical contaminants, heavy metals, petroleum products, and debris originating from outside the farm. 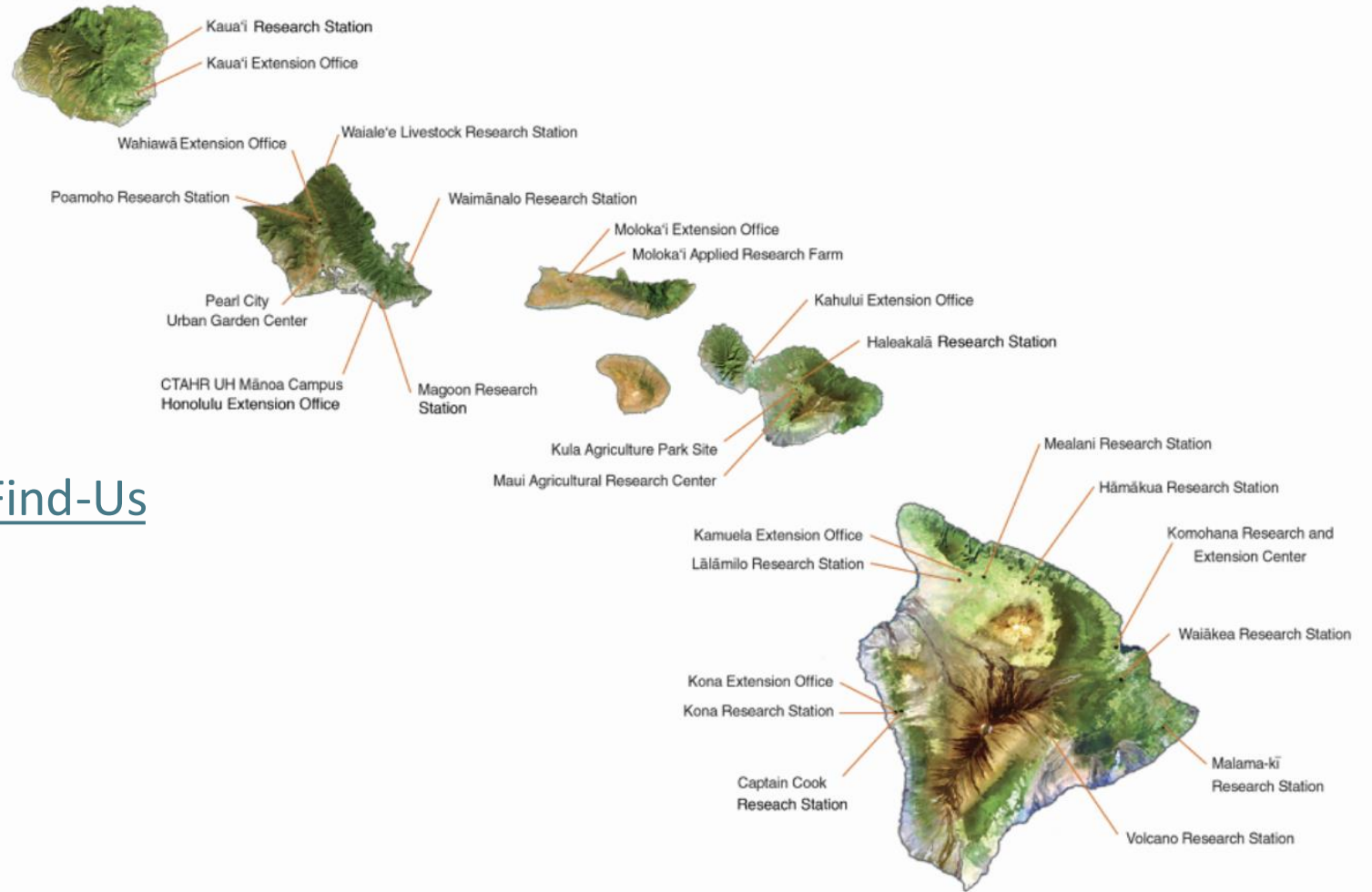
