(Inter-island)

Intrastate Movement of Untreated Green Coffee Beans for Roasting
Between Designated Coffee Berry Borer Infested Areas ¹

Permit No. _____

1. The permittee, name and address of permittee, shall be responsible and accountable for the regulated article(s), green coffee (*Coffea spp.*) beans, and used coffee bags, shipped under permit issued by the Plant Quarantine Branch (PQB).
2. The green coffee beans shall be used for roasting purposes at (name and address of location), a site approved by the PQB. Removal of the restricted article(s) to another site will require prior inspection and approval by the PQB.
3. The regulated article(s) shall be safeguarded by the permittee, name, title, and address, or by trained or certified personnel designated by the permittee.
4. The regulated article(s) shall only be allowed for interisland transport between Hawaii Island and Oahu, designated Coffee Berry Borer (CBB) infested areas, to permittee's name and address.
5. The following are approved methods of movement of green coffee and coffee bags:
 - a. Untreated green coffee beans and coffee bags shall be packed and sealed in two unused, transparent, non-permeable, high-density polyethylene (HDPE) or polyvinyl chloride (PVC) bags that are at least 3 mils thick and that allow clear visual inspection. Within 48 hours of HDPE or PVC bagging and upon receipt of PQB certificate of inspection, the untreated green coffee beans shall be delivered for interisland transport.
 - b. Coffee beans and coffee bags subjected to a PQB approved treatment shall be packed and sealed in unused, transparent, non-permeable, high-density polyethylene (HDPE) or polyvinyl chloride (PVC) bags that are at least 3 mils thick and that allow clear visual inspection.
 - c. Green coffee beans and coffee bags subjected to a PQB approved treatment and shipped in sealed shipping containers within 48 hours of treatment, the container shall be delivered for intrastate transport so as to preclude coffee

berry borer infestation. Within 48 hours of PVC bagging and upon receipt of PQB certificate of inspection, the treated coffee bags shall be delivered for interisland transport.

6. The regulated article(s) shipped interisland shall be clearly labeled as "Inter-Island Shipment of Green Coffee Beans," and "This Parcel May be Opened and Delayed for Agriculture Inspection."
7. Each shipment shall be accompanied by an invoice, packing list or label listing the identity of the regulated article(s), the quantity (number of bags) of the regulated article(s), the shipper and the permittee of the regulated article(s).
8. A PQB inspection certificate is required prior to shipment.
9. The approved site, regulated article(s), and records pertaining to the regulated article(s) under permit may be subject to post-arrival inspections by the PQB. The permittee shall accommodate the post-arrival inspections during normal business hours as requested by the PQB chief.
10. Samples of the untreated green coffee beans may be taken during inspections, including post-arrival inspections, for further examination for CBB.
11. The permittee shall adhere to the use, facility, equipment, procedures, and safeguards proposed and described in the permit application, as approved by the PQB chief and Board of Agriculture Chairperson.
12. The permittee shall have available a procedural or safety manual at the time of inspection which identifies the practices and procedures to minimize or eliminate the risk of CBB contamination.
13. The permittee is responsible for all costs, charges, or expenses incident to the inspection or treatment of the regulated article(s) as provided in Act 173, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, section 13, including, if applicable, charges for overtime wages, fixed charges for personnel services, and meals.
14. It is the responsibility of the permittee to comply with any applicable requirements of municipal, state, or federal law pertaining to the regulated article(s).

15. The permittee shall submit to the PQB chief a copy of all valid licenses, permits, certificates or other similar documents required by other agencies for the regulated article(s). The permittee shall immediately notify the PQB chief in writing when any of the required documents are suspended, revoked, or terminated. This permit issued by the PQB chief may be cancelled upon revocation, suspension, or termination of any license, permit, certificate or similar documents the permittee is required to have for the regulated article(s).
16. The permittee shall immediately notify the PQB chief in writing in the event that the permittee will no longer ship or move intrastate the regulated articles authorized under this permit. In that event, the permit will be cancelled.
17. Any violation of permit conditions may result in citation or in cancellation of the permit, or both.
18. The permit is subject to cancellation and the permit conditions are subject to amendment at any time due to changes in statute or administrative rules restricting or disallowing movement of the regulated article(s).
19. A cancelled permit is invalid and upon written notification from the PQB chief, all regulated article(s) listed on the permit shall not be shipped or moved interisland. In the event of permit cancellation, any regulated article(s) may be moved, seized, treated, quarantined, or otherwise disposed of, at the discretion of the PQB chief. Any expense or loss in connection therewith shall be borne by the permittee.
20. The permittee shall agree in advance to defend and indemnify the State of Hawaii, its officers, agents, and employees for any and all claims against the State of Hawaii, its officers, agents, or employees that may arise from or be attributable to any of the regulated article(s) that are introduced under this permit.
