Grafted Coffee Trees for Sale - Big Island Only

Proceeds support Kona Extension's coffee and orchard crops program.

'Typica' scion grafted onto C. liberica 'Fukunaga' or 'Arnoldiana' rootstock coffee trees are for sale.

Most of these trees have been topped to reduce plant height and strengthen the vertical, and are currently sprouting new shoots just below where they were snipped. They are ready to be planted.

We require the return of the pots and racks as soon as the trees are planted so they can be reused for other projects.

Purchase is on a first come, first serve basis. These trees are greenhouse grown. All sales are final. Absence of coffee leaf rust and other pests or diseases is not guaranteed. Purchase and plant at your own risk.

Coffee Leaf Rust Confirmed on Kaua'i and Moloka'i

The Hawai'i Department of Agriculture (HDOA) has confirmed the detection of coffee leaf rust (CLR) on Kaua'i and Moloka'i. The serious coffee plant pathogen has now been found on all major Hawaiian Islands.

On June 28, 2021, a commercial coffee grower in Kilauea, Kaua'i, reported a possible CLR infection. HDOA collected samples and CLR was confirmed on July 9, 2021. Preliminary assessments indicate that CLR had been on Kaua'i for at least six months.

On June 14, 2021, HDOA staff conducted a survey of feral coffee plants on Moloka'i. A low-level infestation was detected on two coffee plants in a field of 50 wild coffee plants in Kaunakakai and CLR was confirmed on June 23, 2021. Subsequent surveys detected more infestations on the east side of the island. It is estimated that the infestation on the east side had been there for at least three months.

<u>USDA Designates Hawaii County, Hawaii, as a Primary Natural Disaster Area</u>

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through emergency loans. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor (see http://droughtmonitor.unl.edu/), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Hawaii and Pacific Basin Producers Have Until Aug. 2 to Submit FSA County Committee Nominations

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) encourages all farmers, ranchers, and FSA program participants to take part in the Hawaii and Pacific Basin County Committee election nomination process.

FSA's county committees are a critical component of the day-to-day operations of FSA and allow grassroots input and local administration of federal farm programs.

Committees are comprised of locally elected agricultural producers responsible for the fair and equitable administration of FSA farm programs for their counties. Committee members are accountable to the Secretary of Agriculture. If elected, members become part of a local decision making and farm program delivery process.
