#### HI Ag Labor Survey News Release - October 2021

The USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Survey (NASS) will conduct its biannual Agricultural Labor Survey in October. The survey will collect information about hired labor from more than 600 Hawaii farmers and ranchers. NASS will compile, analyze, and publish survey results Nov. 24 in the *Farm Labor* report on the NASS website.

"Agricultural labor data are critical in helping producers when hiring workers and estimate expenses," said NASS Hawaii State Statistician Shawn Clark. "The data that farm operators provide through NASS's Agricultural Labor Survey also allow federal policymakers to base farm labor policies on accurate information."

# STATEWIDE: Hawai'i Organic Growers Must Apply for Organic CostShare by Nov. 1, 2021

Organic producers and handlers can now apply for U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) funds to assist with the cost of receiving or maintaining organic certification. Applications for the Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP) are due Nov. 1, 2021 to your county office of the Farm Service Agency (FSA). Eligible producers include any certified producers or handlers who have paid organic certification

fees. Producers can be reimbursed for expenses made between Oct. 1, 2020 and Sept. 30, 2021 including application fees, inspection costs, fees related to equivalency agreement and arrangement requirements, travel expenses for inspectors, user fees, sales assessments and postage. For 2021, OCCSP will reimburse 50% of a certified operation's allowable certification costs, up to a maximum of \$500 for each of the following categories: crops, wild crops, livestock, processing/handling.

A complete application includes the following:

- a completed CCC-884, OCCSP Application
- USDA organic certificate
- itemized invoice showing expenses **paid** to a certifying agent for certification services **Note:**Records showing an amount due that do not indicate that payment has been made by the producer or handler will **not** be accepted.
- SF-3881, Direct Deposit if not previously filed. Payments will be transmitted via direct deposit.
- CCC-902E, Farm Operating Plan, if not previously filed and the applicant is an entity.

# **USDA Pandemic Response and Safety Grant Program**

The USDA will be opening the application portal at 1:00pm EST for its **Pandemic Response and Safety (PRS) Grant Program**. The PRS program is funded at \$650 million to aid specialty crop producers and processors, other select producers, meat and other processors, distributors, and farmers markets to respond to coronavirus, including for measures to protect workers against novel coronavirus 2019 (COVID–19).

# **Eligible Applicants:**

- Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education
- Small businesses
- Nonprofits that do not have a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education

Applicants will be required to obtain a DUNS Number from Dun & Bradstreet (D&B) prior to applying for this program. D&B has created a custom landing page to streamline this process.

# **NEW! USDA Micro Farm Crop Insurance Policy**

This is a new insurance policy for farmers who sell locally.

USDA has a new insurance option for agricultural producers with small farms who sell locally. The Micro Farm policy simplifies record keeping and covers post-production costs like washing and value-added products. It is offered through Whole-Farm Revenue Protection and is available to producers who have a farm operation that earns an average allowable revenue of \$100,000 or less, or for carryover insureds, an average allowable revenue of \$125,000 or less.
