# ProBlad Verde approved for CLR in Hawaii

HDOA approved a 24(c) Special Local Need Label for an organic biofungicide, ProBlad Verde.

ProBlad Verde fungicide works on contact, tissue absorption and has translaminar properties and is driven by multiple-site modes of action to control fungal diseases within eight hours of contact. Priaxor Xemium is another product is translaminar (across and within the leaf) properties.

**ProBlad Verde is most effective when applied before or around the onset of disease development.** Apply at critical timings for disease control. Begin treatments prior to extensive rain season and or when environmental conditions are conducive for disease development and reproduction. If disease symptoms are evident, spray the leaves and the orange color spores directly. Apply to the top and bottom surface of all coffee leaves. Full coverage of leaves is important. Spray to wetness but avoid runoff.

ProBlad Verde requires two to four hours drying time on plant foliage for the active ingredient to be fixed into the plant tissue before rain or irrigation occurs. If, during the next 12 hours it rains significantly, a new application will be needed during the next 4 days.

- SLN label rate of ProBlad Verde is 45.7 fl. oz. per acre in at least 50 gallons of water per acre.
- Wear proper PPE according to the product label.
- Do not reenter the sprayed area for at least 4 hours after spraying is completed. REI is 4 hours.
- Do not make more than five foliar applications of ProBlad Verde per crop season.
- Do not make more than two sequential applications of ProBlad Verde (FRAC BM01) before alternating or tank mixing with a labeled fungicide with a different mode of action such as Double Nickel, Serenade, copper-based, OxiDate, or Priaxor.
- Do not harvest until 1 day after last application.

# **Organic Integrity Learning Center Course - Conducting Yield Analysis**

Want to learn more about yield analysis? NOP offers a free course on Conducting Yield Analysis in the USDA Organic Integrity Learning Center!

Course number NOP-320 on yield analysis provides instruction on how to complete and evaluate a yield analysis for U.S.- and non-U.S.-based operations. It introduces the concepts and research that underpin yield analysis. It then teaches how to apply these concepts through hands-on exercises. The course explains potential outcomes of yield analysis and provides a framework for evaluating results, with a discussion of caveats and considerations. The course also recommends best practices for documenting yield analysis, which is essential when determining a course of action for operations that may have violated the organic regulations.

Learn more about how this powerful tool helps USDA and certifiers continually strengthen farmer and consumer trust in a fair and competitive organic market.
