Upcoming Q Arabica Grader Course at Pacific Coffee Research



This June, Pacific Coffee Research is welcoming Tim Heinze back to Hawaii Island and their farm-side Lab to host the Q Arabica Grader Combo Training & Exams Course (https://bit.ly/3NzgY4u).

What is "The Q"?

CQI's Q Coffee System is an internationally-recognized program for evaluating cup quality based on a standardized system for Arabica coffee using protocols developed by the SCA. A Q Arabica Grader is a highly trained and calibrated coffee taster who evaluates coffee using SCA cupping standards and protocols.

While there are no required prerequisite courses to take the Q Arabica Combo Course, it is recommended that registered students be familiar with CQI/SCA cupping protocol, the SCA cupping form, and have at least introductory experience with cupping and tasting coffees. <u>USDA Extends Deadline to June 15 for Public to Comment on Competition Challenges in Seed, Fertilizer, Other Agricultural Inputs, and Retail Markets</u>

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announces a 30-day extension to the public comment period to identify the impacts of concentration and competition challenges in seed, fertilizer, other agricultural inputs, and retail markets. **The new deadline is June 15, 2022.**

Three RFIs (requests for information) were published in the Federal Register on March 17, 2022, each with a 60-day comment period ending May 16, 2022.

USDA Accepting Applications to Help Cover Costs of Organic, Transitioning Producers

Agricultural producers and handlers who are certified organic, along with producers and handlers who are transitioning to organic production, can now apply for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Organic and Transitional Education and Certification Program (OTECP) and Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP), which help producers and handlers cover the cost of organic certification, along with other related expenses. Applications for OTECP and OCCSP are both due October 31, 2022.

OTECP covers certification costs for organic producers and handlers (25% up to \$250 per category); eligible expenses for transitional producers, including fees for pre-certification inspections and development of an organic system plan (75% up to \$750); registration fees for educational events (75% up to \$200) and soil testing (75% up to \$100).

Meanwhile, OCCSP covers 50% or up to \$500 per category of certification costs in 2022.

USDA Accepting Applications for 2022 Organic Certification Cost Share & OTECP

Agricultural producers and handlers who are certified organic, along with producers and handlers who are transitioning to organic production, can now apply for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Organic and Transitional Education and Certification Program (OTECP - https://bit.ly/38iGFXY) and Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP - https://bit.ly/3wLZ34Y), which help producers and handlers cover the cost of organic certification, along with other related expenses. Applications for OTECP and OCCSP are both due October 31, 2022.

"By helping with organic certification costs – long identified as a barrier to certification – USDA has helped producers participate in new markets while investing in the long-term health of their operations," said Farm Service Agency (FSA) Administrator Zach Ducheneaux. "We launched the Organic and Transitional Education and Certification Program to build on the support offered through the Organic Certification Cost Share Program and provide additional assistance to organic and transitioning producers weathering the continued market impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. This year, in response to stakeholder feedback, we have aligned the signup dates for these two organic programs and encourage producers to work with the local USDA Service Centers and State agencies to complete the applications. The FSA, and the USDA broadly, are committed to making sure our Nation's organic producers and handlers have the tools they need to continue positively shaping our local and regional food systems."

Announcing FY 2021 Payments for Reimbursement Transportation Cost Payment (RTCP) Program for Geographically Disadvantaged Farmers and Ranchers in Alaska, Hawaii, and Insular Areas

Good news! FY 2021 Payments for Reimbursement Transportation Cost Payment (RTCP) will be issued tomorrow via direct deposit. RTCP payments are calculated based on the costs incurred for transportation of an agricultural commodity or inputs during a Fiscal Year, subject to an \$8,000 per producer cap per Fiscal Year, and a National payment factor, if applications exceed authorized funding. Total FY 2021 claims exceeded available funding; therefore, payments to recipients will be reduced by a National payment factor of 0.7191017 percent. If you were eligible for the maximum \$8,000 cap, the 0.7191017 payment factor would be applied and your actual payment would be \$5,752.81.

Sorry this is a group email and I'm not sure if all in this email applied and were approved for payment. If not, please sign up for the upcoming FY 2022 RTCP.

FY 2022 RTCP signup will likely begin during the first week of July and end the first week of September. I've read and heard about the increases in agricultural operating input expenses (chemicals, fertilizer, gas, feed, etc.). Please keep invoices of your operating expenses directly related to the shipping and/or cultivation of the commodity you produce from 10/01/2021 through 09/30/2022.

A bit of good news for FY 2022 RTCP. We have been informed that the National Office is working on automating FY 2022 payments, and funding will be increased from \$2 million to \$3 million. Fully automating payments will hopefully result in a quicker process and the increase in funding will probably result in a more favorable payment factor and increased payments next year. The goal is for payments to be issued in January or February, 2023 at the latest. That's a goal, though...

USDA Pays Nearly \$2 Million to Producers for Reimbursement Transportation Cost Payment Program

HONOLULU, Hawaii, May 19, 2022 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) today announced nearly \$2 million will be issued to 882 producers through the 2021 Reimbursement Transportation Cost Payment (RTCP) program beginning on May 19, 2022. The RTCP helps eligible farmers and ranchers outside the contiguous U.S., including those in Hawaii and the Pacific, offset a portion of the cost of transporting agricultural products or inputs used to produce an agricultural commodity over long distances.

USDA Designates Two Hawaii Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through emergency loans (https://bit.ly/3GieJAh). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor (https://bit.ly/3MTcHcm), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.
