'Ulu Agroforestry - Free Webinar - 6.15.22

The Hawai'i 'Ulu Cooperative and partners have developed this guide to clarify terms related to agroforestry, which has become a "buzzword" in recent years, and to provide concrete examples of how Hawai'i 'ulu farms currently practice various agroforestry techniques.

We hope this guide and webinar will help Hawai'i 'ulu farmers and backyard growers better understand these considerations and work to implement sustainable, achievable, and effective practices on their land!

- We are accepting SNAP-EBT and DA BUX (https://bit.ly/3QabdfJ) at Alae: SNAP-EBT customers can now purchase our products directly from the co-op in bulk for 50% off (https://bit.ly/39636jz) with pickup at our Alae Facility in Hilo. For example, SNAP customers can now purchase 5 lbs. of fully cooked kalo for \$17.50!!!
- The co-op is purchasing seasonal fresh fruits from farmers. If you're a Hawai'i Island farm with excess fruit or without a market please contact us. We are particularly interested in lychee, white pineapple and avocado.
- In preparation for the upcoming 'ulu season, we are hiring additional agricultural processors at our Honalo facility in Kona. We are accepting resumes (https://bit.ly/3mt7Naf) until June 21, 2022.
- In collaboration with Hawai'i Pacific Health Institute and Chef Hui, we celebrated the May Harvest of the Month crop kalo with Waikiki Elementary School and Chef Dave Caldeiro as a last day of school cooking demo featuring taro latkes! Healthy Soil, Healthy Orchard: from Planning to Practices - July 16

Join Oahu RC&D, CTAHR, and host farm Island Harvest for a field day on Saturday, July 19th from 9:00am to 12:00pm in Kapa'au, Hawaii to engage with soil health planning in orchard systems. This on-farm workshop will share cover crop trials in an orchard system, followed by a demonstration of an AerWay Orchard Aerator and cover crop seeder. We will discuss soil health planning, practices, testing, and the opportunity for funding from NRCS programs for practice implementation. Lunch will be provided. Hawai'i's unique island landscapes and history of soil degradation through intensive crop production heighten the importance of rebuilding soil health. As organic matter and soil nutrients are depleted, farm operations require greater quantities of fertilizers and water to sustain production and experience increased risk of crop failure due to less climate-resilient soils.
