Dear Growers and Friends,

<u>FREE Medical Evaluations and Respirator Fit Testing Events for Coffee and Orchard Crop Producers and</u> Workers

Take advantage of our final appointment slots with Dr. Lindborg on April 12th in Kona and on April 14th in Hilo for FREE medical evaluations. We have three appointment times remaining on the 12th and five appointment times remaining on the 14th. Appointments with Dr. Lindborg take about 20 minutes.

Complete this medical authorization form (Bilingual - <u>https://bit.ly/3KNL9Gp</u>) <u>AND</u> medical evaluation questionnaire form (English - <u>https://bit.ly/3zO6rxw</u> / Español - <u>https://bit.ly/3MycM7Y</u>) and bring the completed forms with you to your medical evaluation appointment. You must first be approved by a medical physician to wear/use a respirator while spraying organic or conventional pesticides and attend a respirator use training event. Once approved, you can then be respirator fit tested to be sure that you are wearing your respirator properly.

Respirator fit testing with Jennifer Weisbrod will take about 20 minutes as well and also require an appointment. We have spots still open on April 12th and 13th in Kona, on April 14th in Hilo, and April 15th in Pahala. But, you must be approved by a medical physician to wear/use a respirator <u>BEFORE</u> you can be respirator fit tested.

If appointment times with Dr. Lindborg get filled or are not convenient for you to attend, you can still get medically evaluated by your primary care physician (PCP) or online by a 3M physician. Complete the medical authorization form (Bilingual) AND medical evaluation questionnaire form (English / Español) and bring the completed forms with you to your medical evaluation appointment with your PCP or complete it online at the 3M website (<u>https://bit.ly/41bwdqY</u>). There may be a fee (\$29+tax) for each 3M medical evaluation or for visiting your PCP.

Our partners from the Hawaii Community Health Center will also be present from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm on April 11, 12, 14, and 15 to measure blood pressure and glucose levels at no cost and with no appointment needed.

Register for sprayer calibration, respirator use and fit testing, and medical evaluations at <u>https://www.hawaiicoffeeed.com/calandrespfittest.html</u>.

Prior to respirator fit testing, be sure to follow CDC guidelines for facial hair and shave as necessary to ensure a secure and proper fit of your respirator(s). Don't forget to thoroughly clean and dry, and bring your respirator with you to your fit testing appointment. Click the posters below to enlarge.

Coffee Industry Survey Re: CLR-resistant Varieties of Catimor hybrids, False Tupi, and Obata

Aloha,

For the past two seasons (2021-2023), UH-CTAHR Kona faculty and staff have maintained, harvested, collected yield and cherry size data, and cupped coffee from individual Catimor hybrid trees at the Kona Research Station in Kainaliu. In April 2023, we will cup the top trees from the 2022-2023 crop. If you would like to learn more about our Catimor hybrid project, please view a recorded presentation at <u>https://bit.ly/40aNqQY</u>.

So far, CLR has not caused sporulating lesions on any of the 20 of trees and 8 of the top Catimor hybrid trees have been confirmed by USDA ARS PBARC as CLR-resistant. Two seasons of observations and harvests have also given us a better understanding of the top producing and top quality trees from this

field. In addition, we have False Tupi and Obata varieties which are also showing resistance to CLR.

Currently, we are at a point of determining if growers are 1) interested in receiving plant materials from these top Catimor hybrid trees, False Tupi, and/or Obata trees, and 2) how growers prefer to receive the plant materials if they are made available to the industry.

We are NOT currently distributing seed or plant materials to the industry. However, to help determine our next steps, please complete this survey and provide us with your feedback - <u>http://bit.ly/43nGFOK</u>. This survey is open to all coffee producers in Hawaii, but is NOT anonymous.

You can also come to the office in Captain Cook for an appointment.

If you need help with spray decisions, and understanding when to use or mix CLR sprays, please see UH-CTAHR's spray document (<u>https://bit.ly/3xHGU85</u>), especially the excellent table at the end on pages 5-7.
