# <u>Informational Meeting For The HDOA Pesticide Disposal Program - Next Opportunity is Tues., Aug. 8</u> Greetings,

This is Adam Williams, Project Manager for the Hawaii Department of Agriculture's ("HDOA") Pesticide Disposal Program ("PDP"). Starting Tuesday, July 25, 2023, from 9am – 10am, the HDOA will be holding a series of zoom meetings to discuss the HDOA's PDP.

The PDP will provide an available, affordable, and environmentally accessible mechanism by which any agricultural entity, licensed pest control operator, landscape professional, pesticide dealer, and other commercial users of pesticides in the State can, for free, dispose of up to 250 lbs of canceled, suspended, unwanted, and unlabeled ("CSUU") pesticides. **No enforcement action will be taken** against participants for disposing of CSUU pesticides.

The goal of the PDP is to promote a cleaner and safer Hawaii by reducing the amount of pesticides which could potentially impact human health or the environment.

We will be discussing:

Acceptable and unacceptable materials;

- Who's eligible to participate;
- Getting registered;
- The event date and time; and,
- Frequently asked questions.

#### **Small Business Grants**

We're always asked about grants for small businesses, and frankly, there aren't many, but here are some we just heard about. If interested act quickly, as application deadlines for some of these are coming up soon.

**PayPal Holdings, Inc., has brought back the Venmo Small Business** grant for a second round. The \$10,000 grant can be used for anything, including rent, or to digitize or promote a business. Apply by August 7 - https://go.hawaii.edu/2oy

The **Antares REACH Grant Program**, in partnership with the Global Entrepreneurship Network, will provide \$20K grants to small businesses. The focus is on companies that have an established product or market fit, have clearly identified needs for growth, and are owned by historically underrepresented entrepreneurs.
