- Rolling deadline, but apply soon
 - Closing date will be posted as funding winds down
- First award letters - late May/early June

HFUF Flood Response Fund: Kona Low Relief Grant

- Farm info
- Type of damage/impact - crop loss, greenhouse, road, top soil/erosion, irrigation, fencing, feed/forage, orchard/perennial crop
- Details: How much, what size, what types, estimated lost revenue, estimated cost to repair
- Attach photos of damage
- Other farm damage or operational impact
- Focus on damage to farms
- Include all info you want to share within the application
- HFUF will require a completed W-9 and legal mailing address to issue payment.
